As to one of the reasons twhyyou parted with Docroux, do you think that Docroux thought that MIME is a unique art, and you thought MIME is one of the styles of theater?

## **MARCEL MARCEAU**

That's right. Docroux was an investigator of basic theory all the time. However, I resembled Jean Louis Barrault. Although Barrault knew how to gain an audience, Docroux was not a person friendly to the audience. Although he was a theorist, a technician and rejection, he was very splendid. However, people did not receive a strong impression from motion easily.

Then, I tried to learn from the way Chaplin impressed the audience with the story.
